

## Mr. T. H. Van Hattum's Famous Rough Collie, Sonnenburgh Squire

At Heath Court, Maidenhead; and de Sonnenburgh, Wassenaar, The Hague, Holland.

IN Collies, SONNENBURGH SQUIRE ranks with the highest in the United Kingdom. A lovely coloured sable-and-white of commanding size, combining body and substance, yet racy in build; clothed with a profuse straight coat, of good texture; head of exceptional length, nicely tapered; good eye and expression; neat ears, perfectly carried. These are qualities which make him a typical Collie throughout. It is an axiom that some dogs are "un-lucky," and this may be said of Sonnenburgh Squire, inasmuch that he has not attained to full championship honours. Unfortunately, he is a dog of "moods," and at times he does not do himself justice in the show ring. But for this he would have earned the coveted prefix during his puppyhood. Nevertheless, he is a consistently big winner, under the best judges, as the following list testifies:—

Many puppies of much promise by him will add more lustre to the name of Sonnenburgh Squire, who should take his place on the roll of great Collies which have left their imprint on this beautiful variety.
